
Continuing Promise

Lines of Effort:

LOE 1	Medical Engagement – Direct patient care and health security cooperation engagements. Support the delivery of partner-led medical care and subject matter expert exchanges, to include BMET and VET support.
LOE 2	Humanitarian Assistance / Disaster Relief (HADR) – Preparedness with partners for disaster response in the AOR.
LOE 3	Women, Peace, and Security (WPS) – Enabling women empowerment and integration of gender perspectives.
LOE 4	Public Engagement – Pierce the Information Space – amplify our story, shape perceptions (KLEs, PA, COMRELs, Band, SEABEEs, Surveys)

USNS Comfort

USNS Comfort is a 1,000-bed Mercy-class hospital ship that provides afloat, mobile, acute surgical medical facilities and hospital services provided by U.S. military and partner agency personnel. This will be the Comfort's eighth iteration of Continuing Promise, more than half of the total Continuing Promise mission sets. Although CP is a fully planned mission, Comfort is capable of assembling and deploying for humanitarian aid and disaster relief missions whenever and wherever necessary!

USNS Comfort to visit SOUTHCOM Region in support of Continuing Promise 2025

Secretary Hegseth made the announcement during the Central America Security Conference, co-hosted by the United States and Panama, which took place in taking place in Panama City in early April.

USNS Comfort is scheduled to conduct a mission stop in Panama, along with mission stops in Colombia, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Grenada, and Ecuador. Commander, Destroyer Squadron 40, will serve as mission commander for Continuing Promise 2025.

"Continuing Promise 2025 reaffirms our commitment to strengthening relationships with our partner nations," said Rear Adm. Carlos Sardiello, Commander, USNAVSOUTH. "We are proud that the USNS Comfort will bring Sailors and civilians together to provide specialized care to those in need."

for USNAVSOUTH. "We have had a great team of representatives from across the military and our partner nations during our detailed planning efforts, demonstrating the level of respect and importance we place on coordination in executing this mission successfully."

Since its inception in 2007, Continuing Promise has treated more than 605,000 patients and performed approximately 7,300 surgeries, leaving a lasting positive impact on partner nations.

CONTINUING THE PROMISE SINCE 2007

Continuing Promise, executed by USNAVSOUTH/FOURTHFLT, is one of U.S. Southern Command's premier efforts to bring health care, humanitarian assistance and civic support to communities in Latin America and the Caribbean on behalf of the people of the United States.

Since its inception in 2007, mission teams have offered medical, dental and veterinary care to local communities throughout the region. Continuing Promise Teams have also provide small infrastructure and construction improvements, such as building schools, clinics and community centers, and repairing roads and water systems.

The mission also fosters goodwill, strengthens existing partnerships, and encourages the establishment of new partnerships among countries, non-government organizations, and international organizations.
